Jessica has worked for educational institutions, arts nonprofits, and civic organizations across the US, including Art in the Loop Foundation Kansas City, The University of Missouri Kansas City, Charlotte Street Foundation, Kansas City Arts Institute, Living Arts of Tulsa, Greenwood Art Project Tulsa,

the University of Tulsa, Oklahoma Visual Arts Coalition, Jacksonville Cultural Council, Museum of Contemporary Art Jacksonville, and the University of North Florida. Additionally, Jessica has written for Number Inc. Arts Journal, Informality Kansas City, Arbus Magazine, and Burnaway.
